July 2018 - Pamela, age 39, was diagnosed with stage IV breast cancer. She, her husband and daughter went to Davenport, Florida, in June. This opportunity of being able to go on this respite did so much for my emotional well-being. Not once did I sit and dwell on cancer!!!"*

August 2018 - Byron, age 34, was diagnosed with leukemia in 2014 and again in 2017. He traveled with his wife and children to Davenport, Florida, in July. Byron states, *"This was amazing. I think we wore ourselves out traveling all of the theme parks! It was so nice to pretend that cancer didn't control the scheduling of my life for a week. We do not hide my situation from my girls. They are exposed to all of it, and they see the struggles that we go through as a family, likewise they also see the triumph and the strength that comes from our family in dealing with this disease. However, sometimes, I wish they had a second chance at their innocence and could not feel the need to pray for me every night. But then I remind myself that everything we go through as a family makes us stronger. This vacation allowed them to still have that strength that they receive from watching and participating in our battle against cancer, but also to have a week of pure innocence and magic. Memories of princesses and superheroes and time with mom and dad outside of medical treatment. This trip served as a great reminder to stop and breathe every now and then and spoil ourselves. It also reminded us of all the wonderful people inside and outside of FPS that have embarked on this journey with us. Thank you FPS for selecting our family for this wonderful once in a lifetime opportunity."*

September 2018 - Alexandra, age 46, was diagnosed with stage III ovarian cancer in January 2018. She and her family traveled to Camp Wavus in Maine in August. She states, *"Maine is beautiful, so thank you so much. This trip was more than what we expected. Camp Wavus exceeded our expectations, and the staff are a blessing. This trip helped my family to enjoy nature and appreciate it. It helped us to reunite and connect more as a family. This trip was magical and it was more special to have met Mrs. Marci Schankweiler. She was kind and unique, it was nice to have her join all the families during this time. She is a blessing for what she does and of course, all her team behind this foundation. We keep you guys in our prayers"*.

You guys are amazing!! Thank you so much. We had the absolute best week. You made that happen."*

She states, *“This trip has been a dream of mine...to take the kids to Disney. I loved seeing their faces and share in their excitement. This trip also really helped my relationship with my husband. It’s a healing start!!! My kids were so excited for their first plane ride and all the parks with fast passes. Amazingly they got along better than usual. They needed this trip just as much as Chris and I. I have always been a “glass is half full” person and look for the good even in bad situations. This trip reinforces this way of living and this outlook. Your wonderful organization does make a difference. Thank you for what you do. We are just so very grateful.”*
