**March 2020** – Art, age 50, was diagnosed with squamous cell cancer of his left tonsil. He, his wife and children traveled in March to Davenport, Florida. Art states, " *This gave me time to relax & spend time with my wife and kids without worrying about expenses. It reminded the kids what life was like before cancer and it reminded me that I won't always feel this tired and soon things will go back to normal.*"
