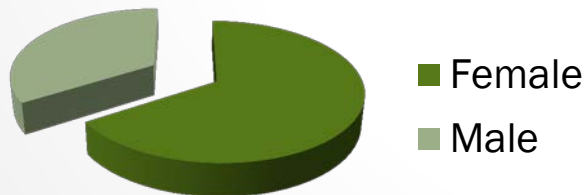
Program Highlights

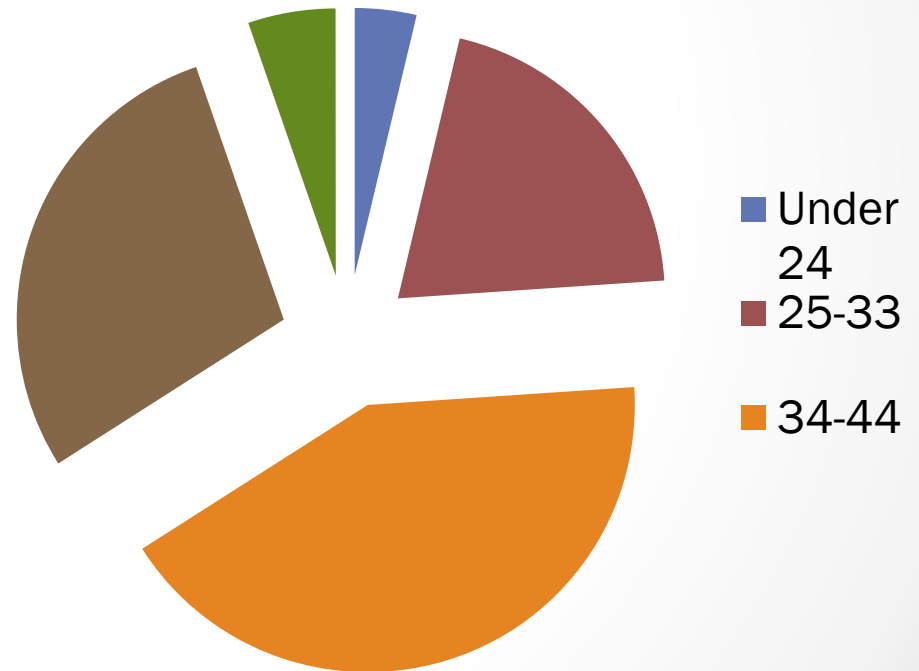

Age of Patients

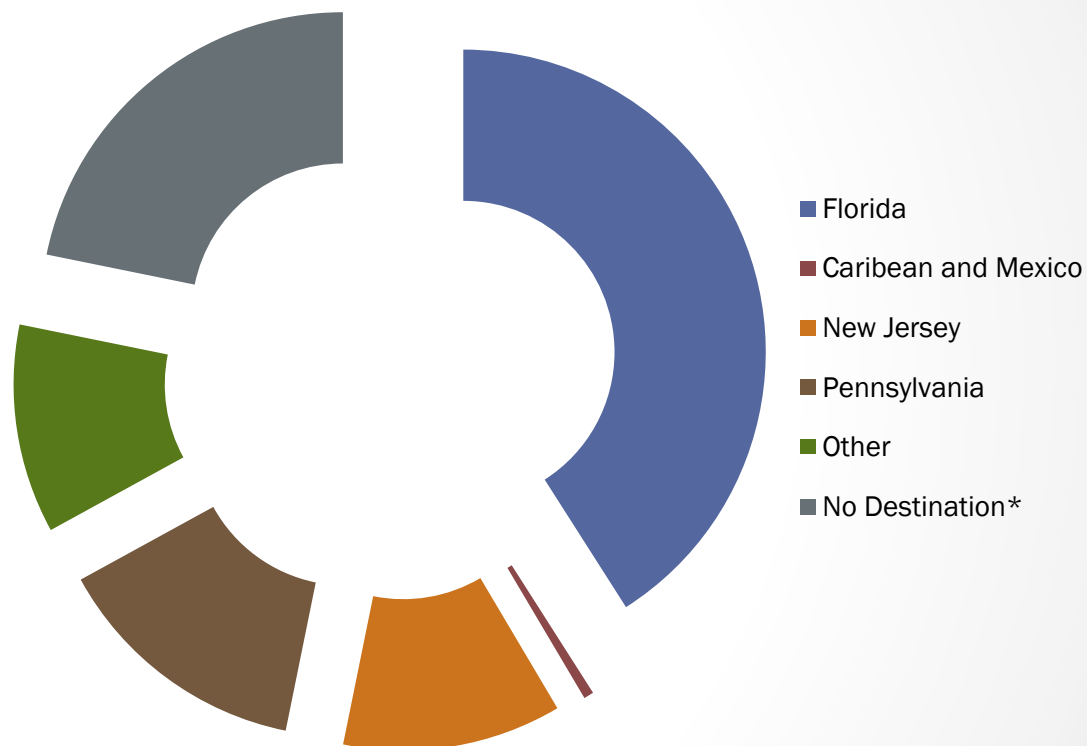

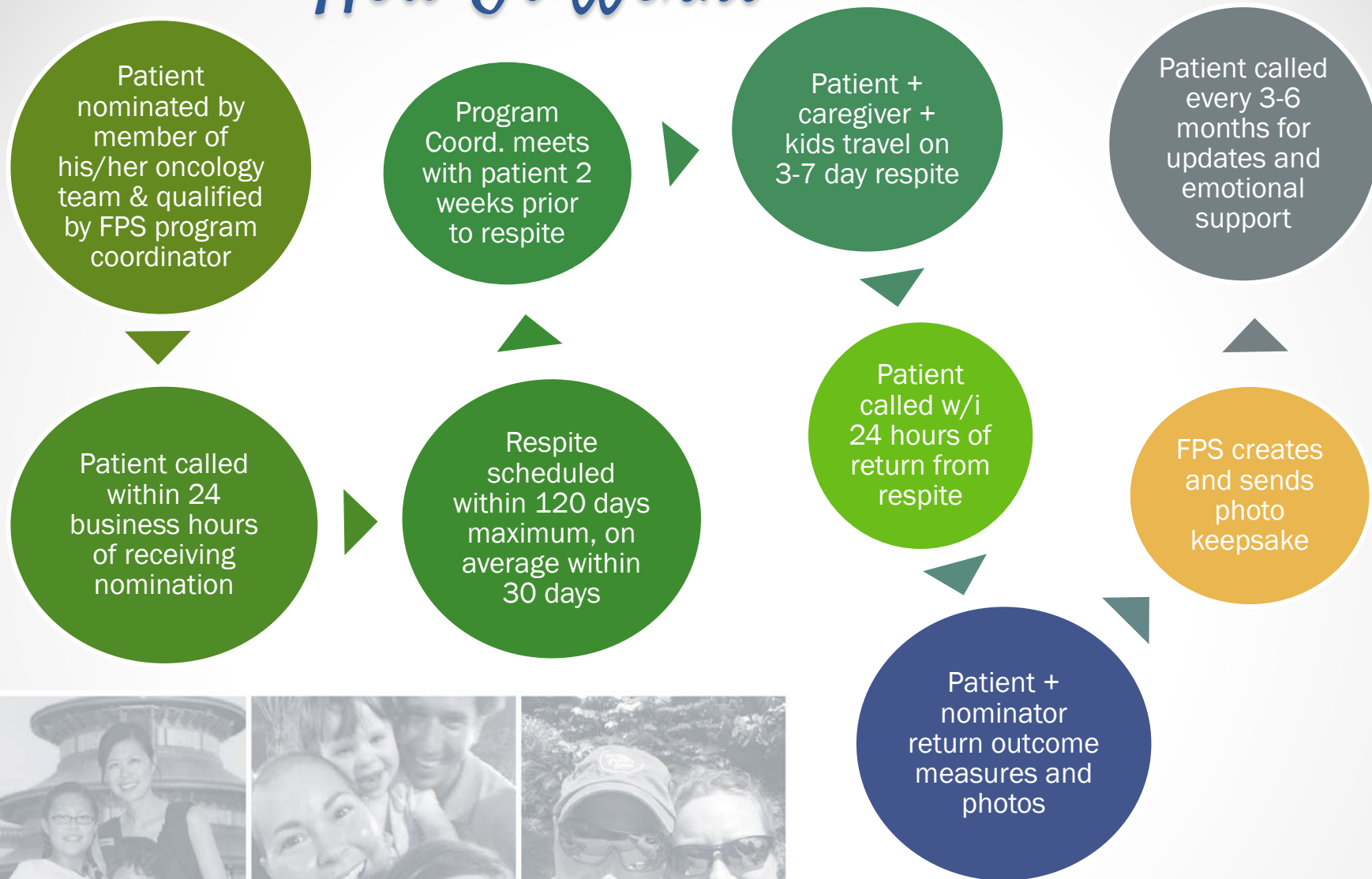

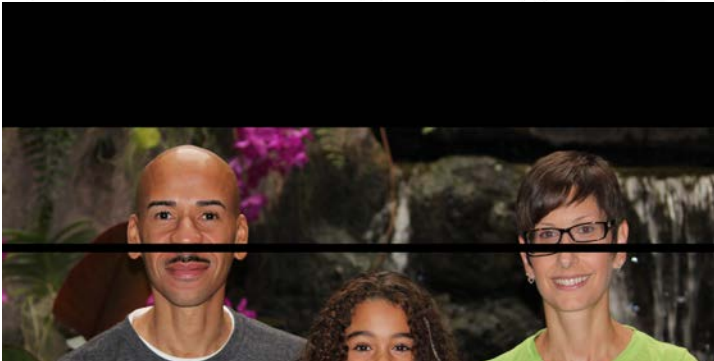

Finances

The Fiscal Year 2014 was an exciting one for FPS. In addition to the growth of Net Assets to almost \$800,000, FPS received a \$25,000 donation to start an endowment. FPS provided 111 respite vacations to 225 adults and 188 children, the most respites in one year. In FPS also received well over \$600,000 of in-kind support in the form of complimentary office space, patient accommodations, professional and marketing services, respite supplies and special event goods and services. These non-cash contributions are critical to the Organization's success and allow FPS to best use its constituent dollars.

FPS is 100% funded by donations from private individuals, private foundations, corporations and community support.

Total Functional Expenses

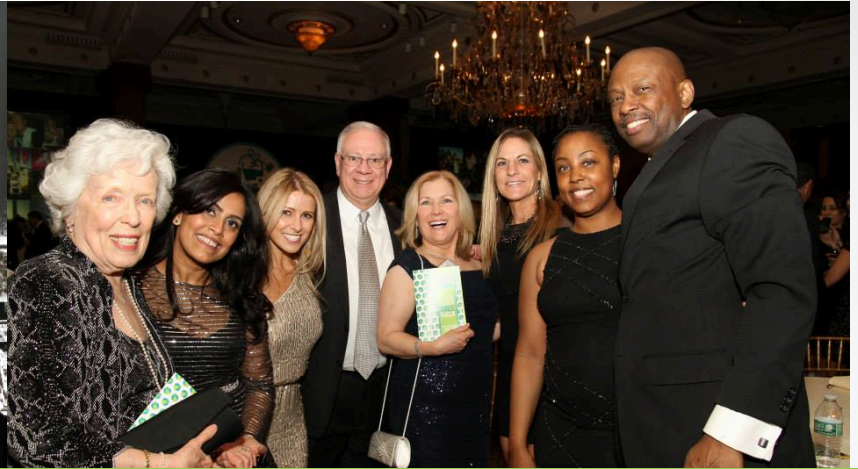

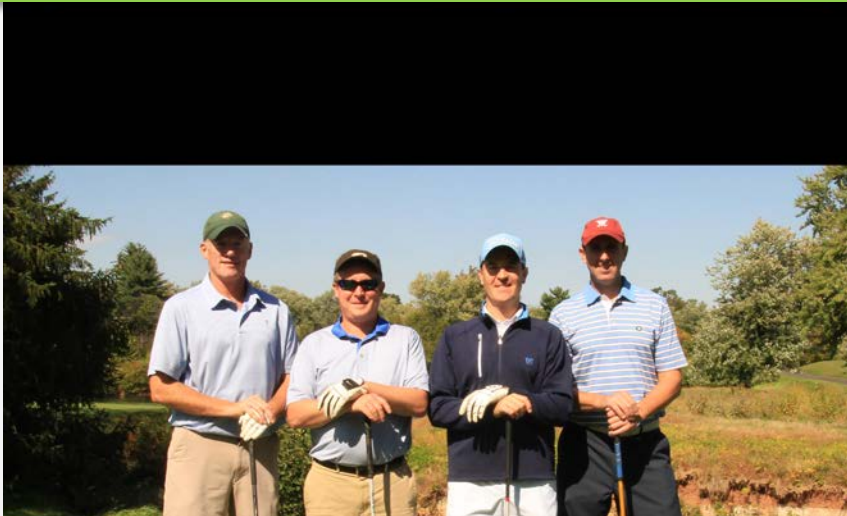

Community Events

Volunteers across the country hosted Community Events to fundraise for the mission of FPS and we are so grateful for their support! In one year, almost 100 events took place! Our volunteers planned runs, bake sales, dress down days, dart tournaments and MORE!

We are so grateful for this unique support that helps us share our mission with new people while raising funds to help give people a break from cancer.



Program Impact

Since 2005, For Pete's Sake has been capturing outcome measures from our oncologists and our patients. 100% of nominating professionals report improvement post-respite in their patient's outlook on cancer. Nominator outcome measures are captured and posted quarterly on our website, and patient outcome measures are captured and posted monthly.

Years of data collected reflects that a break from cancer can have a substantial impact on a patient and caregiver's outlook on and coping with cancer. After studying qualitative and quantitative data routinely obtained by FPS staff following a family respite, a professional research committee has identified four common themes associated with respite benefit: 1) Relationship Quality Among Family Members (includes spouses and children of varying ages), 2) Work and Life Endurance/Renewed Stamina, 3) Patient Treatment Compliance post respite, and 4) Joy/Mental Break.

Using these four major themes, FPS is extending its evidence-based program by compiling additional data immediately post respite, six months post respite and one year post respite for all participants, including patient, caregiver and children. Data is currently being collected to further support the necessity of respite as a family and social support to improve connections not only within the immediate family unit, but with other natural societal connections including those with one's medical team, one's work community, one's neighborhood community and one's extended community. We launched this project in the Spring of 2014 and plan on publishing our results.

Relationship - Endurance - Compliance - Joy



“The impact of being diagnosed with stage III cancer is indescribable. Yet, the support is overwhelming, the humbling experience is eye opening and the stories are unforgettable.

My daughters have stood by my side, attended appointments and held my hand. Our summer outings were not the same and gave the girls a sense of defeat when we could not all go away together as we always had. My sister-in-law took my girls with her wherever she went, while my mother stayed with me. However, the fact that I was home sick hung over my daughters while they were out. This respite is a reassuring gesture to my daughters, as well as myself, that although life is hard, good times are still ahead!” – Quinna Staten, 46, traveled to Johnny’s House in Florida with her mom and her daughters.

Impacting People Nationally

In ten years, For Pete's Sake would like to be a nationally recognized organization.

Infrastructure

With 10 staff members and proven processes, FPS has a strong foundation to support 120 respites per year.

To grow 300% and provide 500 respites annually, FPS will increase staffing and rely on improved technology. Due to the nature of our program, we will not need offices in new locations.

Fundraising

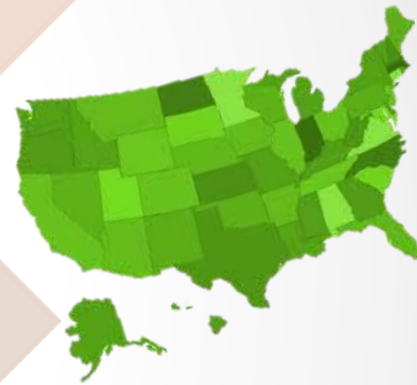
FPS anticipates raising 1.6 million through tried and true revenue streams in FY 14-15.

Creation of a national organization depends on strong planned giving & endowment programs, monthly donors and overall 15% financial growth annually.

Partners

FPS has 7 travel partners which provide diverse travel options for our patients, in addition to our homes in FL.

FPS will need to identify 10 additional travel partners to provide accommodations in new geographic areas, as well as anticipate the cyclical nature of our existing partners.
