It gave my husband time to have fun on a day versus having to run me to various appointments. We got to see him laugh a lot which is a rare thing!!!"*

September 2017 – Mary, age 43, was diagnosed with stage 3 breast cancer in February 2016. She traveled with her husband and children to Camp Wavus in Jefferson, Maine. Mary states, *"This gave me much needed peace and I was able to spend quality bonding time with my family, stress free. This trip helped me find my faith again! Joe needed this stress free time with our family. He is more peaceful and patient. The kids needed this distraction from all that has been going on the past year. You are an outstanding organization and I am honored to have been gifted this incredible trip. Thank you!"*

October 2017 – Kevin, age 47, was diagnosed with peritoneal carcinoma in March, 2017. He traveled with his wife and children to the FPS Respite Vacation Home in Davenport, Florida. He states, *"I felt the cancer/surgery/hospitalizations had separated me from my family. The cancer is what it is, but I didn't want it to take me away from them if possible. This vacation was able to bring us back together and forget all the stresses of this past summer. The trip came at the end of summer where we were essentially barely hanging on. Our kids were shuffled around with different family members while we were away for treatment. Our kids had a ball and even our 17 year old let his guard down and acted like a kid again!!! This trip made us feel whole again as a family after a time when we felt broken and fractured as a family unit."*

January 2018 – Sharla, age 55, was diagnosed with stage IV breast cancer with metastasis in 2017. She traveled with her caregiver to the FPS Respite Vacation Home in Davenport, Florida. Sharla states, *"I feel that I can face challenges, testing, doctor's visits with a more positive attitude now that I have these precious memories and experiences from this respite vacation to enlighten me again and again. I embrace life with more gratitude than ever before as this respite vacation was truly a blessing that I don't take lightly"*.

February 2018 - Christopher, age 43, was diagnosed with colon cancer with metastasis in 2017. He traveled with his wife and children to Johnny's House in Davenport, Florida, in January, 2018. Christopher states, *"I really enjoyed watching my kids excitement and it was nice to get out of my normal routine of doctors. With depression it's extremely hard for me to enjoy life these days. It was nice to create some good positive memories with my kids and spouse. She really felt me needed a break. My children have been dreaming of going to Disney so this was definitely a great opportunity for them. They enjoyed having our full attention."*

April 2018 - Angie, age 45, was diagnosed with stage IIb breast cancer in May, 2017. She and her husband and children traveled to Johnny's House in Davenport, Florida, in April 2018. She states, *"This was the only family trip in 10 years, it was once in a lifetime opportunity. I am still in shock about how great it was and this trip replaced the bad memories of going thru cancer and treatment."*

May 2018 - Sandra, age 52, was diagnosed with stage III breast cancer. She and her caregiver traveled to Congress Hall, a Cape Resorts property, in Cape May, NJ in May. Sandra states that she did a lot of walking and talking with her niece. She also states, *"No matter what we are going thru we can make it the best way we can. Cancer is very stressful! Keep up the great work, many blessings!! Everyone deserves a break from cancer. You guys have done something awesome for me and I will never forget. Now I want to sponsor so someone else can have this awesome experience. You guys are the best!!! Hugs and kisses to all. God Bless."*

June 2018 - Shannon, age 37, was diagnosed with stage IV breast cancer. She traveled with her husband and children to the FPS Respite Vacation Home in Davenport, Florida and she states, *"This respite has made me so happy! It's hard to stay positive and hopeful when the doctors tell you that your cancer is not curable. Ever since I found out about this trip I have been filled with excitement! This was an amazing experience for my family and I. It has inspired me to live life to the fullest and continue to have fun with my kids. I have so many beautiful memories that will make me feel good forever! I've just been so happy since the trip. I can't stop smiling. I'm so grateful for the memories that I will always have.
